I am pleased to welcome my successor in the role as Editor-in-Chief of *Information Systems Research*, V. Sambamurthy of Michigan State University. Samba has extensive editorial experience, including a recent stint as Associate Editor at *ISR*.

He is the Eli Broad Professor of Information Technology and the Executive Director of the Center for Leadership of the Digital Enterprise at the Eli Broad College of Business at Michigan State University. He has previously served on the faculties of the business schools at the University of Maryland and Florida State University. His research has been published in a variety of academic journals including *MIS Quarterly*, *Information Systems Research*, *Decision Sciences*, *Management Science*, *Organization Science*, and *IEEE Transactions on Engineering Management*. His prior editorial service includes *MIS Quarterly*, *Information Systems Research*, *IEEE Transactions on Engineering Management*, and the *Journal of Strategic*

Information Systems. He currently serves on the editorial boards of *Management Science* and *Organization Science*.

His term as Editor-in-Chief of *ISR* will begin January 1, 2005, although he and I have already begun planning the transition of the editorial office. I will provide more of the details of the transition in the December 2004 issue.

Along with welcoming a new editor in 2005, *ISR* will also be saying good-bye to three Senior Editors. Cynthia Beath, Sal March, and Bob Zmud will be transferring to Senior Editor Emeritus status at the end of 2004. Just like Associate Editors who change to Emeritus status, they have agreed to continue serving as editors for manuscripts in progress that they have been responsible for, but will not be accepting new manuscripts. It has been *ISR*'s good fortune to have had the hard work and careful judgment of these three scholars.
