Report on Management Science Research Centers

In its report of May 15, 1960, the TIMS Committee for a Management Science Research Center¹ recommended that TIMS should support an International Center for Management Science to be affiliated with the Econometric Institute of the Netherlands School of Economics under the direction of Dr. Henri Theil. It further recommended that this support be continued for a period of five years and that it be supplemented by financial support from TIMS at the rate of \$2,000 per year. It was thought that the value of such a grant would be enhanced if it were made in a way that "(a) minimized restrictions on its expenditure and (b) emphasized the fact of its being a part of TIMS' officially expressed desire to help in supporting the Center's activities."²
