THE JANUARY 1966 issue of the *Bulletin* of the Canadian Operational Research Society reproduces in the original and in translation a notice of the May 1964 joint ORSA-CORS Montreal meeting that appeared in the first 1965 issue of *Technical Cybernetics*, a Journal of the Academy of Sciences of the USSR. The Soviet commentator observes that "most of [the papers presented at the meeting] . . . dealt with modelling of various problems on computers. . . . It was confirmed by visits to various companies that this is the main tendency in the practical application of OR at the present time."

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
