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In the article “The Paradox of Corrupt Networks: An Analysis of Organizational Crime at Enron,” by Brandy L. Aven (*Organization Science*, Vol. 26, No. 4, pp. 980–996), there were minor errors. In Table 1, the correct average for the total number of members in all projects should be 397, not 340.286. In addition, the text on page 986 should be amended to read: “Nevertheless, the largest corrupt project (size = 171) was comparable in size to the smallest noncorrupt project (size = 264).”
