Chairman, Theory of Traffic Flow Symposium Selection Committee

As Chairman of the Transportation Science Section of Operations Research Society of America, 1965-66, I served as Chairman of the Advisory Committee for the selection of the site of the Fourth International Symposium on the Theory of Traffic Flow. This Advisory Committee, with international representation, selected Professor W. LEUTZBACH, Technische Hochschule, as the Chairman of the Fourth Symposium which will be held in Karlsruhe, Germany during the early summer of 1968.

As in the previous meetings, which took place in Detroit, London and New York, the Symposium will serve as an international forum for discussions on the latest research in road traffic.
