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1979 DISSERTATION PRIZE: TRANSPORTATION SCIENCE SECTION, ORSA

The submission deadline for the 1979 dissertation prize of the Transportation Science section of ORSA is June 15, 1980. The prize is \$250 and there is an honorable mention for the runner-up. Any thesis (Master of Science, Doctor of Philosophy, or equivalent) submitted during calendar 1979 is eligible. Theses will be judged on the basis of overall high professional quality and contribution to transportation science.

Each thesis must be submitted by the thesis supervisor and accompanied by a cover letter which includes the student's current address. Five copies of the thesis and of an extended abstract (four double-spaced pages)—both in the English language—should be sent to:
